**Dried Beans Potential Source Of Extra Warmth and Energy**

With many wintery months ahead the "fuel" foods that give us the extra warmth and energy we need are more important than ever. And especially, the inexpensive dried beans, so easy on the budget and so delicious when properly prepared, is high on the list of the good, basic protein foods.

The navy or pea bean is ever popular, but the lesser known cranberry, yellow eye and kidney bean, all iron and vitamin-rich, can add appetizing variety to a hearty, well-balanced meal.

- 1 cup diced celery
- 1 cup chopped walnuts
- 1 small green pepper, chopped
- 1 T mayonnaise and 1 T catsup, mixed
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 or 4 cloves
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 tsp. parsley
- salt to taste

Soak kidney beans overnight and then boil with the onion, cloves, parsley, bay leaf and salt until tender. When cooked, strain, let them cool off and bring to a low temperature in the refrigerator. Combine with all other ingredients and mix well.

**CRANBERRY BEAN CASSEROLE**

- 1 cup dry Cranberry Beans
- 1 lb. pork sausage
- 1 can condensed tomato soup
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion

Soak beans overnight. Simmer till tender, season with salt and pepper. Drain and reserve liquid. Brown sausage, pour off excess fat. Add beans, tomato soup and onions. Pour into greased baking dish. Add bean liquid to cover. Top with strips of bacon and bake at 425 degrees for 30 minutes. Deviled ham may be substituted for sausage.

1 teaspoon pepper  
2 qts. boiling water  
2 carrots, sliced  
2 onions, sliced  
2 potatoes, sliced  
1 teaspoon salt  
Cover beans with cold water and soak overnight. Add other ingredients. Cook slowly until beans are tender. Add more water if necessary. Serve with beans whole, mashed, or rub mixture through a sieve and season, adding hot water if too thick. Serve topped with lemon-cakes. Serves 8.

**Wintertime Efforts Result In Preparedness for Spring**

There are dozens of odd jobs that can be done now to avoid the unexpected that usually faces gardeners each spring. What will probably seem like an almost endless winter to the ardent gardener can provide an excellent opportunity for gardeners to get tools in shape for spring work.

Seed catalogs can be sent for and studied to determine what varieties will be used in the garden next spring. It's also time to study the results of your past year's gardening efforts. Why did some crops do well, while others failed?

Did you use the right insecticide, the right variety, plant too thickly, or at the wrong time? Many other reasons could be found, but whatever they are, they're of little value unless they're translated into the 1953 gardening plan.

Other suggested jobs for the gardener include ordering fertilizer, cleaning dusters and sprayers, and repair of hotbed or coldframe sash.

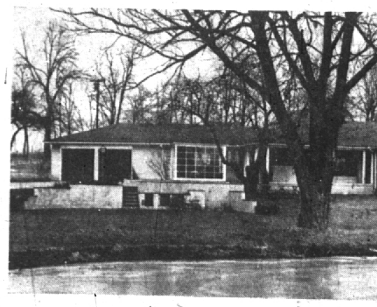
