**Plenty of Winter Sports Available Right Near Home**

Winter sports fans in the Birmingham area can, next spring, almost use the book title of a World War II entertainment group, "We Never Left Home."

Forecasts for the winter season imply that if the weatherman will go along with the idea, every sport will be available right in Michigan, with facilities rating right along with the best in the country.

Western Michigan resorts are prepared to accommodate lovers of any type of winter sports—even those who like to sit close to the fireplace and just enjoy good company.

Sports centers are not just planning for the weekend traffic, but will provide top facilities for those who like mid-winter vacations or are able to get out during the ordinary work-week.

Among the spots specializing on this mid-week program are Boyne Falls, Caberfae, where ski slopes, lifts, instructions and all the rest will be available.

WESTERN MICHIGAN has 11 other spots to offer, including Mount Manselona on US-131, one of the newest. With the first snow of 1,200 and 2,100 feet will be ready for use, complete with rope tows.

Holiday Hills near Traverse City with its three tow-equipped slopes, is also offering the services of a skating rink and large arvery range this year.

Hickory Hills, entering its second season, has expanded. It will have six lighted runs open this year.

Potoskey, old-timer among the winter spots, is once again concentrating on skating facilities and planning a spectacular ice review in February. The state's winter queen ceremonies will be held during this ten-day period.

Other points of interest to the winter sports followers will include Briar Hill, Elberta Mountain, Echo Valley, Avalanche, Sugarloaf Mountain and the Schuss-away area at Lowell.

National meets are scheduled for some of these resorts with noted skiers, such as Hans (Peppi) Toischer, on hand for training and others.

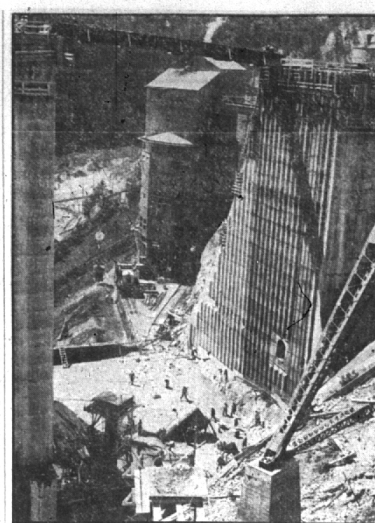

President Truman turned on the power Oct. 1 and dedicated the project which was completed 14 months ahead of schedule by the General Shea-Morrison Co. at a cost of \$103,000,000.

**Township Awaits Radio Station**

Bloomfield township soon will operate a police radio station in the township hall, Supervisor David E. Anderson disclosed this week.

The 60-watt station is expected to be in operation after March 1. The two-way radio will enable township officials to contact police and fire equipment directly from the offices rather than relaying all calls through the City of Bloomfield Hills' station.

THE TWO FIRE trucks at the township hall as well as the truck at the Bloomfield Village station will be equipped with radios.

Cost of the station equipment will be \$2,813.39. Anderson stated that the radio would be installed as soon as approval is received from the Michigan State police.
