**PLAY IT SAFE!
Dry Cleaning
At Home Can
Be Dangerous**

The process of dry cleaning garments or other fabrics in the home is one of the most dangerous jobs that can be attempted. Some liquid materials required for this operation have the lowest flash point possible for petroleum products.

Most people who attempt this work in their homes do not have the proper knowledge of volatile liquids nor do they have the proper equipment for testing them.

With the majority, the first thought in cleaning is to use naphtha or gasoline. Because of the volatile characteristics of these liquids they vaporize faster than any other. The fumes, being heavier than air, spill over the top and out of the cleaning vat or tub to cover the floor area and then build up a density throughout the room.

The person using this material is never conscious of this density until ignition from a stove, match, light switch or some other source has touched it off. The result is usually serious burns or death to the operators and occupants of the home, plus heavy damage to the building.

Recently approved, noninflammable liquids have appeared on the market. The label on their container indicates whether or not the material is safe for home cleaning. If you must do home cleaning for what few pennies are saved, use this type cleaning material and read the label thoroughly.

Remember—PLAY IT SAFE!—The lives of members of your family are too valuable to warrant the chance you take when you do home cleaning with naphtha, gasoline or other highly inflammable liquids.
