Wabeek Plans New Charge Service

A new charge sales plan for retail merchants in the Birmingham area and metropolitan Detroit will soon be introduced by the Wabeek State bank, according to George B. Judson, president of the Detroit bank.

Under the plan, this bank will become a community credit center for neighborhood retailers, enabling these merchants to extend credit without the disadvantages of financing. The customer will be able to charge purchases at authorized dealers and the merchant will deposit the charge slips at the Wabeek bank.

Wabeek then will bill the customer each 30 days for all purchases made under this plan.

A DISCOUNT will be charged to the merchant and no charge will be made to the customer.
