

Bel-Airs First In Intermediate League Standings

Approve Necessity Of Paving Cole St.

A public hearing on the necessity of paving a 600-foot section of Cole street from Etoh road east was approved by Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

Residents who petitioned for the improvement asked that the width be kept to 26 feet with no parking allowed because abutting industrial property already was served off-street parking.

Only objector to the petition was the Arcadia Manufacturing Co., 1081 Eton, which contended that the present gravel road is in satisfactory condition.

The city also agreed to be the agent between Cole street property owners and the contractors for the construction of a 200-foot sewer extension to serve property east of Eton.

Rubbish And Water Members Renamed

City Manager Donald C. Egbert and City Engineer L. R. Gare will again represent Birmingham as members to the Southeastern Oakland County Garbage and Rubbish and Water Authorities, city commissioners decided Monday night.

Gare will be the representative to the water authority; with Egbert as alternate member, and Egbert will be the representative to the garbage and rubbish authority with Gare as alternate.

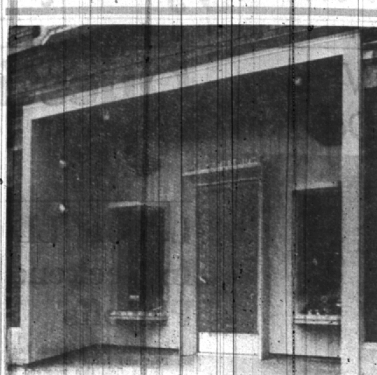

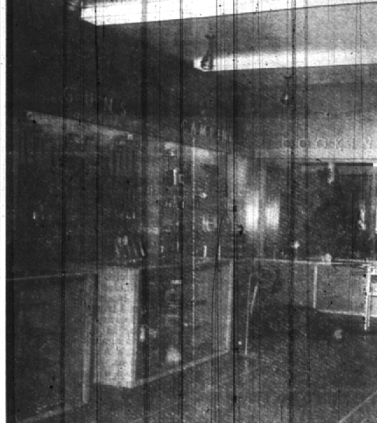

Southfield Bd. Delays Rezoning Bendix Land

Southfield township board members Tuesday night refused to act on a petition to rezone land in the township for the Bendix Aviation Corp. until building and plot plans are submitted to the board.

The township zoning board had reviewed the request of the firm to rezone a 46 acre parcel of land on the northeast corner of North-Western and 10 1/2 Mile road from residential to industrial research and recommended the change in zoning to the township board.

About 20 property owners were present at the meeting to voice their objections to the locating of the company.

Irvy Hermanoff, Detroit, owner of 75 acres north of the Bendix property, opposed the rezoning and stated the majority of land owners in the area objected to an industrial corporation existing in a residential area.

OTHERS in the audience questioned the technical research zoning asked for in the petition. Township officials explained that the TR zone was especially drawn up by township zoners to allow a research use to land and still limit the noise, smoke and other nuisances from destroying property values.

Supervisor William Roesser said that board members felt that the Bendix Corporation would be an asset to the township.

It was explained that the firm was contemplating using 50,000 square feet of floor space for research laboratories. Work would include chemistry, physics, hydraulic, electronics and engineering.

Another complaint lodged against the rezoning was that the township was opening the doors to industrial use of land on Northwestern highway.

Board members agreed to take a long look at the plans for the building and take a tour of the firm's present research building in Detroit before acting on the rezoning.

CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, MICHIGAN Amendment to Zoning Ordinance Residential Density in Business Zones

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, August 3, 1953 a public hearing will be held in the Commission Room of the Municipal Building in the City of Birmingham to consider an amendment to the zoning ordinance, being Ordinance No. 221 of the City of Birmingham, limiting residential density in the business and industrial districts.

The proposed amendment would limit residential development in the business zones to that which is permitted in the income bungalow district and would prohibit residential use in the industrial zone except for a caretaker and his family.
