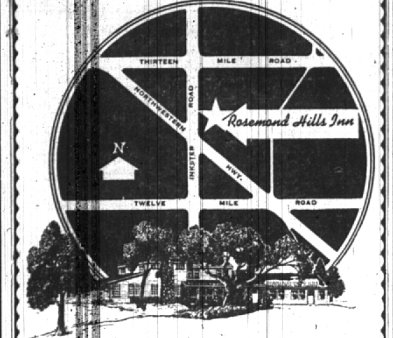
OK Water Main

Southfield Girl Drowned Thursday

It took a tragedy to make a hero out of Dick Sweazy, 13, of 1673 Dell Rose Dr., Square Lake. Mary Lou Ruhman, 13, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Everett Ruhman, 22901 10 1/2 Mile road, became Oakland County's sixth drowning victim when she drowned in Square Lake Thursday noon. There might have been a seventh and an eighth if it had not been for the quick thinking of young Sweazy. He was cleaning the basement of his home when he heard the cries for help. The boy jumped into his boat and rowed to the scene of the tragedy. He helped Carol, 12, Mary Lou's sister, into the boat and told Ruhman to hold on to the side of the boat. "I thought it was a fake at first," said the youth, "but when I kept screaming, I rowed over fast."
