The Townsite Community church, Congregational, has announced the engagement of a full time director of religious education.

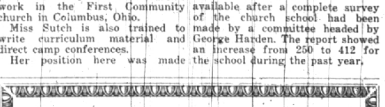
Miss Naida Sutch began her duties there on July 15.

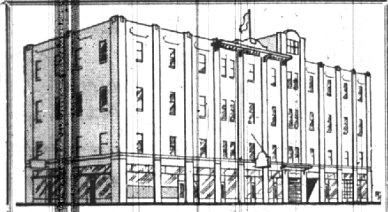
