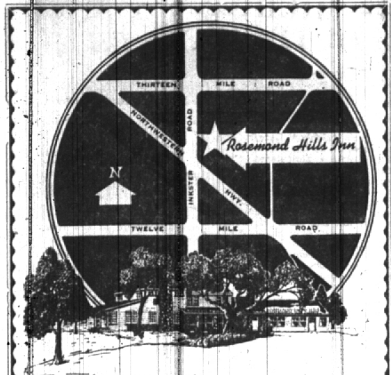


Made Pantlind Manager

His widow is survived by three children, Bruce, Jr., Constance and Marilyn; Constance is the wife of Mr. and Mrs. Harold H. Corson of Birmingham and two brothers, John Corson of Park Ridge, Ill. and Theodore R. Corson of Grand Rapids.
Services were held Saturday afternoon from the Manley Babley funeral home with burial in Greenwood cemetery.

Supreme Court Refuses To Rule On School Suit
The suit brought against the Birmingham Board of Education for injuries suffered by a child who collapsed at a Birmingham-Royal Oak football game, November 25, 1952, was refused by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. The court's decision means that the Birmingham Board of Education will not be held liable for the injuries suffered by the child.
The Michigan Supreme Court recently declined to rule on the school board's immunity against a \$200,000 suit for damages brought by Dr. Maurice Richards, a Royal Oak dentist who claims that injuries he sustained in the accident have shortened his working day.
The question of a school board's liability may rest on the outcome of the suit. Other school boards in the state have hesitated to take on the expense of purchasing liability insurance because the act itself might admit to their liability.
The claimant has stated that since an admission charge was made and attendance at the game, the sport becomes a profitable business and its operations should be held responsible for accidents.
His life in Birmingham was jeopardized by the accident, and he was forced to leave his home in Royal Oak, where he had been a high school in 1926. He was in the real estate and insurance business here for many years, moving to Oakland about five years ago and later to Texas.
He is survived by his widow, Vera; a son James, stationed with the U. S. Army in Korea, and two daughters, Susan, who at the time of her father's death was en route to Europe on the Itasca Westman; and a younger daughter, Judith, at home.
Services were June 23 from the Wayne Chapel of the Highland Park Presbyterian church.
