### Fleeing In Stolen Car, Youth Shot

A 15-year old Clarkston youth was wounded in the elbow during a police chase through Birmingham streets during the early morning hours of July 22, and was held as a police prisoner at St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Pontiac.

Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley said the youth received a slight elbow wound when officers Glen Poltz and William Andrews fired about eight shots at the tires as he fled down Southfield in a stolen car.

The boy, a parole violator, had been sought by juvenile authorities for about two weeks, Moxley said. Patrolman Ronald Pincumb, driving south on Woodward, noticed the car pulling out of an alley on Lincoln and gave chase. The car was driven rapidly through side streets in the southern section and Pincumb's radioed for help. Pincumb joined the force on July 1.

POLTZ AND Andrews, working in the area, joined the chase just as the youth was giving Pincumb the slip.

They said he wove through side streets, disregarding stop signs and lights at Lincoln and Southfield.

The warning shots were fired after the youth passed the 14 Mile intersection. The chase continued to 12 Mile before he was wounded and an attempt to steal a car from McDonnell Monday night.

Moxley said the prisoner stole a car here last September and was arrested in Detroit for driving the wrong way on a one-way street.

He was sentenced to Boys Vocational school at Lansing.

SINCE HIS arrest Wednesday, police said he has confessed to attempted entries at the Tom McDonnell auto office and Birmingham drug store about two weeks ago, and an attempt to steal a car from McDonnell Monday night.

Police, who noticed the car pushed part way into the street, failed to capture the suspect whom they thought was about 20 years old and six feet tall.

Moxley added that the boy stands six feet and weighs about 140 pounds.

"He will be returned to the juvenile authorities as soon as the released from the hospital," Moxley said.

### Award Contract For Addition To Barnum Jr. Hi

(Opening of bids for the Bloomfield elementary school addition and securing the contract for work on the Barnum addition were high lights of the July 21 Birmingham board of education meeting.)

The Barnum contract, awarded to E. H. Boshamer company, was for \$202,000. It includes general construction, mechanical and electrical work and kitchen fixtures.

General construction bids for the Bloomfield job were received from the R. D. Boshamer Co. for \$204,420; Boudin Construction Co. for \$204,550 and Ellis Construction Co. for \$220,000.

Mechanical contractors bidding were Enterprise heat and power, \$107,127; J. E. McDonough, \$99,104. Electrical plumbing and roofing, \$85,500 and W. Willard White, \$91,080.

### OUR BIDS

were received for electrical work, lines Electric Supply Inc., bid \$12,425; Morse electrical, \$30,500; Peterson electric, \$11,200 and Schultz electric, \$24,300.

Board members said that going on the basis of accepting all low bid bids, the work would exceed estimated costs by more than \$100,000.

The board took no formal action on any bid, saying it would need time for a complete study to see where possible savings and reductions might be made.

SUCH A STUDY resulted in saving more than \$32,000 from bids of the new 100-room school to be constructed in the Beverly Hills area. The contract with the Leont-Linden Construction Co., a board spokesman said, will probably be signed this week.

Cost-saving changes include the use of gypsum rather than steel in the roof construction, reducing landscaping to simply grading with a planting program spread over a period of years; aluminum rather than steel window sash and several minor changes in the finish of school rooms.
