Auto Crash Takes Two Lives

Two persons, a man and a woman, met death in a fiery two-car crash on Telegraph road, half a mile south of Long Lake road, at 6:05 a.m. Wednesday.

Victims have been identified as Robert A. Menninger, 65, of Detroit, and Miss Shirley Ann Jensen, 24, of Redford, an employee of the Detroit Childrens Aid Society.

Bloomfield township police said there were no witnesses to the accident which apparently happened in the southbound lane.

MENNINGER'S car struck the rear of the auto driven by Miss Jensen, driving the gas tank into the body of the vehicle where it exploded, trapping the young woman. Because she was so badly burned, identification was delayed several hours.

Township Police Chief Clark Green said it appeared that Miss Jensen was driving north, and somehow lost control of her car, swinging into the southbound lane in front of Menninger.

"The trucks were hard to decipher," he said, "because it was raining so hard at the time. It's possible that another car side-swiped hers, and failed to stop."

"WE HAVEN'T yet been able to locate Mrs. Menninger and the Detroit police tell us the house appears to be closed for a vacation period."

"We found a small sack with some lunch in the Menninger car and a can full of garbage. It leads us to believe that Mr. and Mrs. Menninger were vacationing somewhere near here and that he was on his way to work in Detroit. We think he was taking the garbage to his home from some resort which did not have collection facilities. This is being checked now."

A spokesman for the society said Miss Jensen, driving a society car, was en route to Armada, Mich., to get a child, hearing the police theory that she had been traveling north.

"THE SOCIETY spokesman told us Miss Jensen might possibly have spent the night with friends in this area, and started out early in the morning," Green said. "This will be checked with her family as soon as possible."

Police at first felt that Menninger may have suffered a heart attack. However, an examination by Dr. William C. Prevette, county coroner, said he received a crushed chest and skull fracture, either of which might have caused death.

Manager to Study Presbyterians' Proposed Land Buy

A request by the Presbyterian board of church extension in Detroit to purchase six city-owned lots on East Maple has been referred to City Manager Donald C. Eberhart for study.

The request was made at Monday's commission session by Donald R. Zimmerman, representative of the church board. The Rev. W. Glen Harris, pastor of the First Presbyterian church here, is vice-president of the board and working with Zimmerman in planning the establishment of a second Presbyterian church in the city.

COMMISSIONER Dean Beier said he felt the church should be asked for its plan of development, particularly on parking, before commissioners take further action. Zimmerman pointed out that the board was the agent of the Presbytery of Detroit which plans and develops new churches for rapidly growing areas such as the Rembrandt and Greenfield sections of Birmingham.
