New Well Commissioned; Water Consumption Still Below June, '52 Record

The new Wakefield well was put into operation on July 15 by the city of Birmingham to meet the constantly increasing demands for water.

Although pumping records the following day reached the 4,884,500 gallon mark, it is still more than half a million below the all-time high reached June 14, 1952. On this day well records showed 5,256,700 gallons of water passed through the city's pumps.

City Chief V. W. Griffith reported to City Manager Donald C. Eckert that the new well was working satisfactorily, pumping about 1,000 gallons per minute.
