Composer of Dance Drama's Score Is Former Detroit

Bernhard Heiden, a composer well-known to the Detroit area, has written an original score for "Dreamers on a Slack Wire," a new dance-drama to be given at the Cranbrook Green Theatre in late August.

Now an associate professor of music at Indiana University where he is teaching composition, Heiden was conductor of the Detroit Chamber Orchestra, a staff arranger for radio station WWJ and a member of the Center Music School faculty. His compositions have been performed by nationally prominent orchestras, including the Detroit Symphony.

In 1951 he won the Fine Arts Quartet Composition Award in a national competition, and he has written special music for both stage and screen, including an art film entitled "Conspiracy in Kyoto," currently showing at the Metropolitan Museum in New York.

Collaborating with Austin Jones, writer, and Marion Nevill Kirk, choreographer, Heiden chose two instruments for "Dreamers on a Slack Wire" because he felt that piano combined with the effects of xylophone, tom-toms, gongs, snare

The Players' 1953-54 program was outlined month by month with specific reference to each department's responsibilities, budgetary requirements and limitations.

ALSO DISCUSSED was a schedule of designers and scenic chairmen for each of the individual shows slated for the seven months from October through May.

Scenic design for the lead-off production, a public performance of "Mr. Roberts," will be done by George F. Green. The responsibility for obtaining the more than two hundred "props" required by "Mr. Roberts" will be that of Mrs. Gordon F. Jeynes.
