American League Farm Team Beats Nationals

A five-run first inning enabled the Little League farm team all-stars of the American League to beat those from the National League, 5 to 2, Saturday.

The losers credit the rivalry to four but could not come through in the pinches except in the third inning when John Shelley and John Dady, both of the Cardinals, singled home the only tallies.

A single hit, an error, three walks and two hit batters by pitcher Walter Coe of the Cardinals provided the scores for the American league.

JOE COOK (Hades), and Billy Phillips (Eagles) each pitched two innings and then Curtis Ashcraft (Steelers) struck out six of the last seven batters to douse the National hopes.

Kent Rathburn (Hams) and John Stern (Eagles) starred at bat for the winners while Dady and Art Stewart (Redskins) were the Nationals' leading hitters.

It was a big day for young Ashcraft, a 12-year-old, who three days earlier sold the Eagles to two hits to hand them their first defeat, 2 to 0. Only the 49ers' 9 to 7 loss to the Hams kept the Eagles alone in first place.

THE CARDINALS clinched the National League title by defeating a stubborn Reskin nine, 7 to 5. Other scores: Colts 8, Rockets 2; Bears 8, Texans 0; Bisons 5, Panthers 0; Lions 20, Wildcats 8; and Bulldogs 9, Packers 8.

This week's play ends the farm league's season.

Springdale Cabin To Remain Active Under New Plans

With the adoption of a schedule of operation, final disposition of the Girl Scout cabin at Springdale Park has been made by the Birmingham recreation board, city commission and Lions club.

The Lions, builders of the cabin, last year faced the problem of what to do with the building when Birmingham Girl Scouts became affiliated with the Oakland county district. Except for limited activities, the cabin was too small to fill their future needs.

A committee of the recreation board met with members of the Lions committee on work among boys and girls to formulate plans, subject to city commission approval.

It has been agreed that for the period of July 1, 1953 through June 30, 1954, scheduling and day-to-day inspection of the cabin will be handled by Robert Fauteck, Springdale Park superintendent.

The cabin will be made available for the recreation program at the discretion of the director, Mrs. William Jackson.

It was brought out that the Lions' interest in the cabin will be mainly during the period when Boy and Girl Scout groups are active. The Lions' chairman, Donald Parry, will meet with Fauteck and Mrs. Jackson prior to this time to draw up rules and plans for the cabin's use. They will include plans for such times as the park is closed to the public.

Groups, other than Scouts, must have approval of the recreation board director and the Lions club before permission to use the cabin will be granted.
