City Postpones Rezoning of Eton Triangle

Because negotiations have not been completed on a compromise settlement of a zoning suit against the city of Birmingham brought by the Industrial Land Co. Frank Newell, and others, the city commission Monday night postponed for two weeks a rezoning hearing on the affected property. Agreement has not been reached on two points, reported the city's attorney, Earl Phillips of Pontiac. He said the plaintiffs now want the compromise to include public streets in the computation of area to determine the number of family units, as well as an additional five per cent of the multiple family area to be used for multiples and terraces.

When the city turned down a petition to have the property rezoned from single families to multiples, the property owners went into court on the claim that the zoning was unfair to the best use of the property. Circuit Court Judge Frank Doby has adjourned the case until Aug. 3 awaiting the outcome of the proposed compromise and possible rezoning. AT MONDAY'S public hearing, residents from the subdivision immediately west of the railroad told commissioners they also wanted to see the city fight the case, even to the extent of appealing an adverse decision to the state supreme court. Declared George Mullin, 1240 Birkham, "Since the war, nine new homes have been built west of the railroad, and 14 more fine residences are planned. This represents an investment of about \$300,000. If that can happen just west of the railroad, it can happen just east of it, and anyone who says it can't just doesn't know what he is talking about!"

Child Suffers Injuries When Hit by Car; Police Stress Prompt Reports

Norman James III, 4 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman James Jr., 1627 Berry, suffered chest and head injuries July 19 when he ran into the path of a car driven by John D. Harrison, Jr., 2723 Bewick. Harrison told police he was driving slowly when he saw the child dart from the curb near his home into the path of the car and was unable to avoid hitting the boy. Harrison was not held. Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley commented on the tragedy, said some time elapsed between the accident and the time police were notified. He said all accidents should be reported to the police immediately. "This is especially important in personal injury accidents," Moxley said. "We have facilities here for handling the case and summoning medical aid promptly. A life may be saved by calling the police at once."
