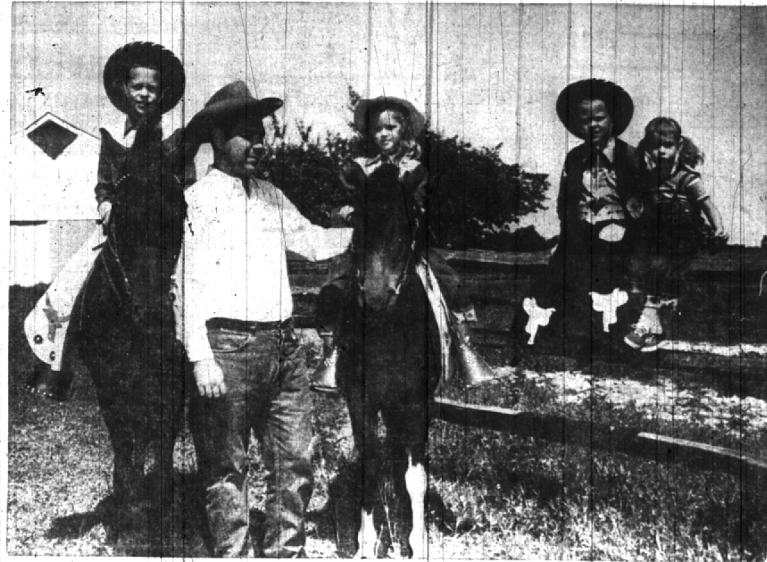

Shortly, a chairman and crew will be selected to apply the grease paint for each of the seven monthly shows starting in October. Creation of a weathered, South Sea look is tops on the agenda, with the Players' first production of the season, "Mister Roberts," and its cast of thirty men and one lone female requiring the largest make-up crew.

The "work-shop," according to Mrs. Colgrove, is designed specially for the benefit of newcomers to the art of stage make-up who want to learn the fundamentals of applying base, color to eyes, cheeks and lips, necessary shading for age, grief, illness, imbraces, if necessary, and the application of wigs, beards, sideburns.
