

New Gas Pipeline Benefits B'ham

Completion of a new pipeline to speed the movement of large amounts of natural gas into Birmingham and all South Oakland County municipalities when zero temperatures prevail was announced today by Michigan Gas Storage Co., a subsidiary of Consumers Power Co.

The new line extends 20 miles from Laingsburg, near Lansing, to Okemos, paralleling another big natural gas transmission line and connecting at each end with other portions of the Michigan Gas Storage Company transmission system.

WITH A DIAMETER of 26 inches, it has a larger capacity than any pipeline previously built by the company, which operates large natural gas fields in the north-central part of the Lower Peninsula.

In these fields, gas from the South and Southwest is stored during warm months to meet the peak needs of Consumers Power Company's customers in the winter.

"This new pipeline will make it possible for Consumers Power Company to meet the peak demand of 350,000,000 cubic feet of gas per day, which is about 100,000,000 cubic feet above the peak day experienced in 1952," said Donald E. Herringshaw, vice president.

OUR SYSTEM is planned to meet the highest foreseeable peak, cause next winter may be much more severe than last winter.

Construction of the pipeline was begun in May. It was placed in service this week after successful testing at pressures in excess of gas for space heating, but also because of those it is to carry.

Rezoning Requests Will Be Studied

Requests to rezone two groups of lots from single family to business A have been received by Birmingham city commissioners from F. K. Graef and Elmer W. Haack. Lots are located on the east side of Southfield, between 14 Mile and Southlawn, in the Birmingham Greatview subdivision.

Two lots are held by Graef, two others by Haack. Graef points out that the original platting designated his lots for business, but were apparently not brought to the attention of those preparing the zoning map.

HAACK SAID the two holdings were far better suited for business purposes and asked they be changed.

The requests were referred to the plan board for study.

Also referred to the plan board was another request for rezoning in the East Maple Gardens subdivision.

This concerns lots 23-33 and 34-44 in the petition signed by Mike Harabedian, Alex Hatos, Young J. Moore and Haack.

Petitioners, who have been refused the rezoning at least twice before want the Maple frontage designated for Business A and the lots in the rear to permit parking.
