Wesley Klewicki allowed Birmingham only four hits. Now Hamtramck will travel to Bay City to play in the Little League state championships slated for July 31.

Hamtramck started right off with a run in the first inning but Birmingham came back and picked one up in its half of the first to tie the score. Then it scored again in the second inning and twice in the third to move ahead, 4 to 1.

Hamtramck came fighting back for three runs in its half of the fourth inning and shut out the Birmingham club for the rest of the game.

THE GAME was marked by some exceptionally good baseball and the little fellows looked like future major league material the way they handled themselves on the diamond.

In the second inning, a squabble arose when third base umpire We-Schke got in the way of Eddie Bush as he rounded second base. Bush was trapped and slid safely into second. He then scored on a fly ball and an error.

Hamtramck sewed the game up in the fifth inning when it came right back to tally three more times in the fifth inning and assure itself a trip to Bay City.

BOTH PITCHERS pitched good ball but it was costly errors that got Birmingham into trouble and kept it there. John Dixon struck out seven of the opposing batters. Klewicki only struck out two, but he didn't allow

a single walk and contributed a sharp single and a double to help win his own ball game.

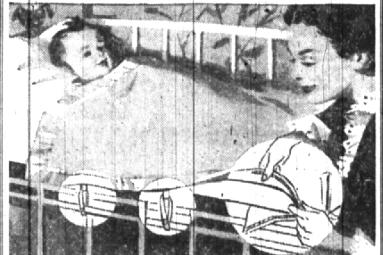

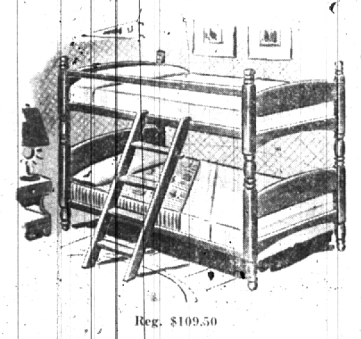
