Lutheran Church Begins Planning First Addition

With the reception of a recent adult class Our Shepherd Lutheran church has reached a total of 800 communicant members, according to the Rev. H. G. Allward. He said the Sunday school enrollment is currently 287.
"With totals such as these," he said "we can easily see the need for hurrying the development of preliminary plans for an additional unit to the church building.
"Although we have nothing specific planned at this time, the new addition is scheduled to house the Sunday school classes."
Our Shepherd Lutheran church began its community services in the fall of 1949 in a small chapel at 14 Mile and Melton. This building, with a seating capacity of approximately 150, was used until a new edifice was erected and dedicated in October, 1951.
This \$75,000 building was the first to be erected on a long range plan of three units.
Mr. Allward was appointed pastor of the congregation at the opening of the original chapel.

He has been director of student work at the Universities of Michigan, Minnesota and Iowa, as a past president of the Association of Presbyterian University Pastors and served on the committee for the better understanding of Mexico a few years ago.

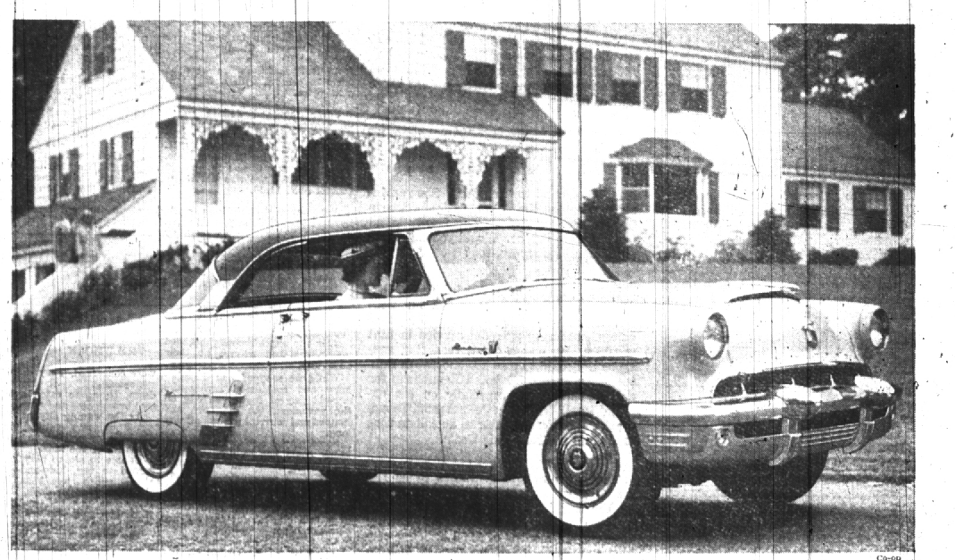
