Crisp and Cool—the Perfect Snack



SOMETHING crisp, something cool, with a refreshing combination come summer and hot days. These crisp oatmeal cookies, made the quick, one-bowl way, team up with tall glasses of icy cold milk to fill the bill.

Bake them plain or bake them fancy; just take your pick of flavors from the variations given below. Use raisins now while they're plentiful; or, try the richer version with chocolate pieces and nuts. Any way, don't forget the rolled oats makes them crisp and good for you, too.

Quick Mix Oatmeal Cookies: Add 1 cup sifted all-purpose flour, 1/2 teaspoon soda, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup fat, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup granulated sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 2 tablespoons milk, 1 1/2 cups rolled oats, uncooked.

Bainis-Spire Cookies: Sift 1 teaspoon cinnamon and 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg with the dry ingredients. Add 1 cup raisins with the rolled oats.

Chocolate Oatmeal Cookies: Add 1 1/2-ounce package semi-sweet chocolate pieces and 1/4 cup chopped nuts with the rolled oats.

Orange-Cebran Cookies: Substitute 2 tablespoons orange juice for the milk. Add 1 teaspoon grated orange rind and 1/4 cup pecan nut with rolled oats.

Peanut-Oatmeal Cookies: Add 1 cup coarsely chopped peanuts with the rolled oats.
