

## Changes Listed For Operation Of Greenwood

Changes in the future management of Greenwood cemetery, proposed by Birmingham city commissioners, would include increased sales prices for lots and services.

Lots which have previously sold for \$80 would be raised to \$125 minimum, with \$175 maximum, depending on which are most desirable. Opening and closing a grave would be raised from \$25 to \$50.

A further study was asked before a decision is made on the purchase of a tent for graveside services and a lowering device, grass blanket and the like.

IT ALSO WAS suggested to commissioners by City Manager Donald C. Egbert that the sale of lots be restricted to Birmingham residents only, and that some regulations be considered on providing that future burials would be in a vault of permanent enclosure to reduce maintenance costs.

Regulations concerning plantings also were suggested.

The cemetery has been operated for about 80 years and prior to being deeded to the city in 1947, was controlled by a cemetery association.

Egbert pointed out that funds are insufficient to maintain the cemetery so that it will not become a liability to surrounding properties.

The increased fees, he said, would do much to enable the city to improve these conditions and bring cemetery conditions to a standard at least equal to the city's several parks.
