### Mexican Craft In July Exhibit At Institute

Gaudy serapes and brilliant silks from the entire month of July. The exhibit includes art from Market Place to Museum on clay, pottery, glass, tinware, silver, wood carving, paper mache, lacquer, weaving, hand embroidery and basketry.

One outstanding display is a six-foot table cut in the shape of a man of Mexico, on which are placed models and objects of various types indicating location of the country's natural resources and major industries.

Since weaving is the oldest and still the most widespread handicraft of Mexico, samples of nearly every kind of Indian clothing will be seen. Scarves, the showiest and most important of hand-woven objects, serve as overcoats for men, covers at night and to spread things on in the market place.

Little figures called "Diablos" often grotesque and fantastic, illustrating the keen sense of humor and craftsmanship of Indian culture. These dolls, representing the play sports of children, are usually done in gaily painted papier mache.
