

WHITING TAKES THE RED OUT OF THE FOOD BUDGET

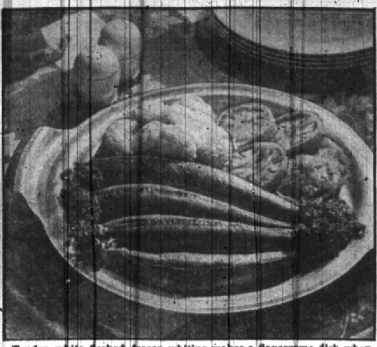

WAY down in price, whiting, a slim, trim little fish, is big news in high-quality protein. Caught around Gloucester waters, it is being frozen in headless, scaled and dressed form and sent to inland markets all over the country. Its tender white flesh has made it one of the most popular fish items today.

You'll like it fried, baked, broiled, in casserole or creamed dishes. Here are two really wonderful recipes. You and all the family will like them.

Broiled Whiting Dinner

Allow one to three dressed whiting for each person. Wipe whiting with damp paper toweling. Place in pre-heated greased broiler pan. Sprinkle fish with lemon juice, garlic salt and pepper. Slice one or two tomatoes and place on broiler pan with fish. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place broiler pan 4 to 6 inches from source of heat. Broil fish and tomatoes 10 minutes. Meanwhile, wash one head cauliflower. Remove leaves and separate into sections. Place

in pressure cooker with 1/2 cup hot water. Cook 1 1/2 minutes at 15 pounds pressure, or else steam in a kettle. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Pour melted butter over cauliflower. Serve with broiled whiting and tomatoes.

Whiting Creole
(4 servings)

Four small whiting, 3 tablespoons butter, 1 medium onion, in rings; 1/2 green pepper, sliced; 2 tablespoons flour; 1 No. 2 can tomatoes, salt and cayenne pepper. Have fish dealer dress whiting for cooking, or buy frozen whiting already dressed. Melt butter in a skillet. Add onion rings and green pepper slices and cook until onion is clear and tender. Sprinkle in flour and cook, stirring constantly until mixture is a golden brown. Stir in tomatoes. Season to taste with salt and pepper using cayenne pepper if desired. Cook about 10 minutes. Add whiting, cover fish flakes evenly when tested with a fork. Remove fish to hot platter and serve with hot creole sauce and lemon slices.
