The award will go to the two members of the graduating class who "most nearly embody the characteristics" which made Marc so well liked and respected by all, namely integrity, citizenship, leadership, and interest in all student affairs.

The senior class was screened by an ad hoc board commissioned to select not more than three nor less than two candidates qualified for each award.

This board was composed of Mrs. Ruth Ashe, Harold Newcomb and Charles Thurston, senior advisers; Mrs. Carol Haring, class counselor; Tom Sheehan, president, and Ann McDonald, secretary, of the junior class; and John Hubert, representative of the Student Congress.

AFTER ELIMINATIONS by the selected board, names of candidates will be sent to the honorary board which will make the final selection.

Composing this board are Rosa A. Wagner, principal; Johanna Holt and Stuart Scheffe, members of Marc's class of 1952; Alan W. Joslyn, Marc's father; and Miss Dorothy Allen, representing the high school faculty.

The awards will consist of two fine watches, suitably engraved, which throughout each recipient's life will serve as a constant reminder of the things Marc stood for. The watches will be purchased from the proceeds of a trust fund established with the National bank of Detroit as the Marc Joslyn memorial trust fund.

This isn't fun (in case you never tried eating caterpillars) so we suggest you get a can of DD-IDE and a good sprayer and get to work.

1. Stop cutting asparagus in a week or two and dress with 5-10-5 or 6-10-4 or 4-12-4. If there are many beetles on the fern growth spray with ROTENONE, DDT or LEAD ARSENATE or dust with DDT or ROTENONE.
2. Spray potatoes at first sign of potato beetles with DDT.
3. Apply CUTWORM DUST to ground in vegetable and flower garden.
4. Get a load of SULPHUR on your phlox for red spider and mildew. Cover upper and lower surfaces of leaves.
5. Bean plants, well out of the ground, must be covered with ROTENONE. Cover both sides of leaves. DO NOT USE DDT.
6. AMMATE for poison ivy.
7. Start raising your lawn mower so it will be at least two inches high in late June (unless you want more crabgrass than usual).
8. This is now the time to fertilize the lawn again. We recommend STADLER'S XXX or WOODRUFF'S TURF BUILDER at half the spring rate—1 lb. to 100 sq. ft.
9. Don't dig up tulips until foliage yellows.
