Poison ivy and poison dak have leaves in clusters of three, other vites have five. Every person in the family should be taught to spot the three-leaf clusters and leave them alone.

THERE IS MUCH folklore, surrounding the subject of poison ivy. Some people believe that it grows only in wild woodland places. Others think the twing a few of the leaves will produce immunity. But hose who have tried it have suffered internal poisoning. A parson who has once handled the plant without pelsoning way think he is immune, but on the next contact he may effer ill effects.

Dr. Bedford Shelmire, authority on the subject, says that very part of the plant is poisonous—even the roots, for the exic principle of the lyv is carried in its oily sap. Prevention, however, is better than cure, and the best ray, is to remember that old saying:

"Leaflets three and let it be."


