

Judge Upholds Revised Dog Ordinance

Associate Justice John Emory, upholding the recently revised dog ordinance of the city of Birmingham, ordered Mrs. E. A. Kimberly, 711 Abbey, to pay fines of \$13 and E. G. Rockwell, Sr., 361 Wellesly, a fine of \$7 and \$3 court costs in a Wednesday morning hearing.

Mrs. Kimberly, owner of two small dogs, said the animals had been permitted to roam when a delivery man neglected to close the yard gate as he left the property.

Stating that she had made every effort to keep the dogs under control, she asked whether dog owners were expected to live up to the "letter or spirit of the law."

By the owner or some person acting with his permission. Attorney Rockwell, acting for his son, E. G. Rockwell, Jr., a student at Ann Arbor, appeared on a warrant and complaint signed by Dog Warden Ralph Riley.

Riley explained that the dog was across the street and several houses away from the Rockwells' residence at the time the ticket was issued. Asked if he would plead guilty to the charge, Rockwell chose to stand mute and abide by the court's decision.

MINOR HIMSELF drew Ticket No. 35 when his 12-year-old cocker, Today, wandered across the street. "He wandered off the edge of the property," Minor said, "and this was my Riley!"

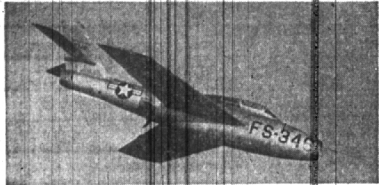
Stating that he felt Riley had done a very good job since being put on full time duty, Minor said he did feel owners were entitled to a warning ticket for a certain period. Moxley said this had been ordered.

The question of the legality of charging the \$1.50 bond bill for dogs which have never been taken to the pound also was brought up at a public hearing, and in discussing the ordinance until it has had a longer test and Riley "starts being a little more liberal."

FESTIVE HAM CASSEROLE
