Artists of both local and international reputation will augment the regular faculty of Cranbrook Academy of Art during the summer session opening June 22. A prize-winner in the recent international sculpture competition held in London for a memorial to "the unknown political prisoners," Gabriel Koln of Alta Antioche, France, will direct the sculpture courses. Koln has won over 20 major awards, including the George G. Booth Scholarship for 1952-53 at Cranbrook, and has exhibited in the art centers of Europe and America. Michael Waskowsky, assistant professor of art at Kalamazoo College, will teach painting. A painter, graphic artist and art historian, Waskowsky graduated from Cranbrook art academy in 1940, and has exhibited widely throughout the country.

CERAMICS COURSES will be conducted by Marietta Hippie, prominent teacher in the Detroit public school system and exhibitor in many national ceramic shows. Asalea Thorpe, summer weaving instructor, has won awards in the Most Rose Design Competition, the Wichita Art Association show and the Michigan Artists-Craftsmen Exhibition. Mrs. Thorpe, who has studied and traveled extensively in Europe, served as lecturer and juror this spring for the Indiana State Weavers Guild. Permanent Academy faculty members who will teach this summer are: Theodore Ross, jewelry design; Richard Thomas, metalwork; and Robert Snyder, architecture.
