Miss Frances A. Papineau, teacher of music at the Wing Lake, Vaughan and Pine Lake schools for the past two years, will fulfill a lifelong ambition when she sails for Europe early in August to accept a teaching post with the United States Army dependents school system.

A three-fold desire to travel, teach and visit the ancient French city of her ancestors will soon materialize, for Miss Papineau has been selected by the Department of the Army Civilian Personnel as a teaching principal and will be assigned to one of the USARUR schools in France or Germany.

It is quite possible that a stranger to most of us would place her in Bordeaux, France, birthplace of her forebears many generations ago. Equipped with a thorough knowledge of the French language, she intends to unravel the family tree in the hope of discovering some distant relative, heretofore unknown.

MISS PAPINEAU expects to remain in Europe at least a year and is looking forward to the challenging experience of teaching abroad.

Prospective teachers for the dependents schools are carefully screened and only those with enthusiasm and ability to develop the best in scholarship and citizenship in young Americans are accepted.

The dependents school program, which is composed of two tiers known as the 7555 Dependents School Detachment and the Dependents Education Organization, was established in 1946 by the Department of the Army to provide public-school education to eligible dependent children of U. S. military personnel on active duty and civilian employees of military agencies in certain overseas areas.

ORDINANCE NO. 417  
AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 416, BUILDING CODE OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM

Section 106.2, Change in Use: If the use or occupancy of an existing building is changed to a use or occupancy which would be prohibited in a new building hereafter erected of similar location and size, the entire building shall be made to conform to the requirements of this code for a new building in the same district and of similar location and size.

Section 106.3, Height and Medium Hazard Class: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.4, Fire Protection: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.5, Sanitation, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.6, Electrical: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.7, Plumbing: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.8, Mechanical: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.9, Fire Escape: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.10, Stairways: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.11, Egress: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.12, Signs: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.13, Safety: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.14, Other: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.15, Enforcement: All buildings and structures of moderate hazard class, hereinafter erected, shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of similar location and size.

Section 106.16, Severability: If any provision of this ordinance is held to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

Section 106.17, Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect on the 1st day of July, 1953.

Section 106.18, Repeal: All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 106.19, Approval: This ordinance was adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Birmingham on the 17th day of June, 1953.

Section 106.20, Attest: I, the Mayor, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a true and correct copy of the ordinance as adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Birmingham on the 17th day of June, 1953.


