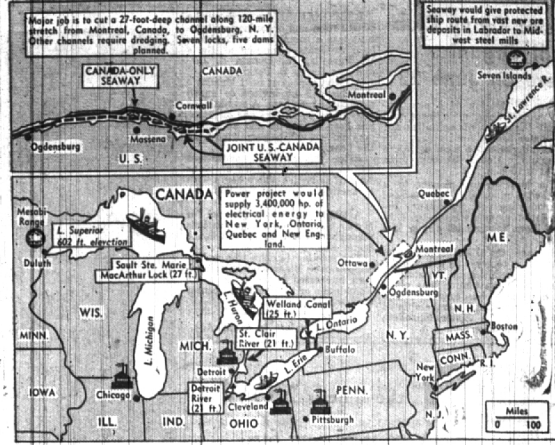
Summer plans include a picnic on July 26, when prospective members and their wives will be guests. Another event, planned for late August, is an informal dance.

Of the 236 miles which will be opened to ocean traffic, only an approximate 100 miles need revision. It is estimated three years will be required to complete the seaway. Dotted line shown in the inset is the route which will be used in the event the United States participates in the project.
