APPETIZER

Need a recipe for a quick, tasty appetizer for a dinner party that is economical? If you do, try this. Combine a cup grated sharp cheddar cheese with ½ teaspoon of prepared mustard, ½ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce and a tablespoon of mayonnaise. Spread a teaspoon of this mixture on the top of each of 16 one and one-half inch toasted circles of enriched bread. Place on a cookie sheet and broil for a bubbly turn. Serve at once.



Q. What is the name of this cut of meat?
A. Pork fashion style shoulder rack.
Q. Where does it come from and how is it identified?
A. It is the broad arm section of a fresh picnic shoulder. The shoulder is seared or skewered where the bone is removed and one side left open for stuffing.

Q. How is it prepared?
A. By roasting. The shoulder is filled with a bread, fruit or vegetable stuffing, skewered or seared, then sliced fat side up on a rack in an open roasting pan. Water is not added and basting is not necessary. The stuffed shoulder is roasted in a 300° F. oven for 1½ hours and bastes 1 ½ to 2 hours.

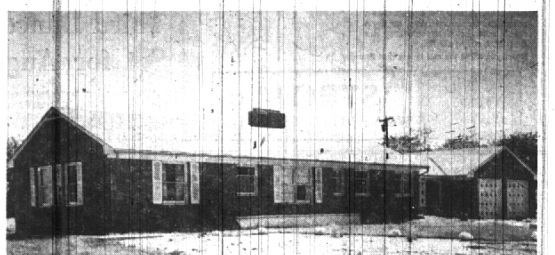

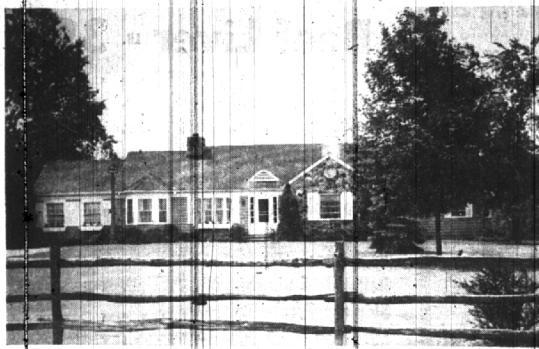

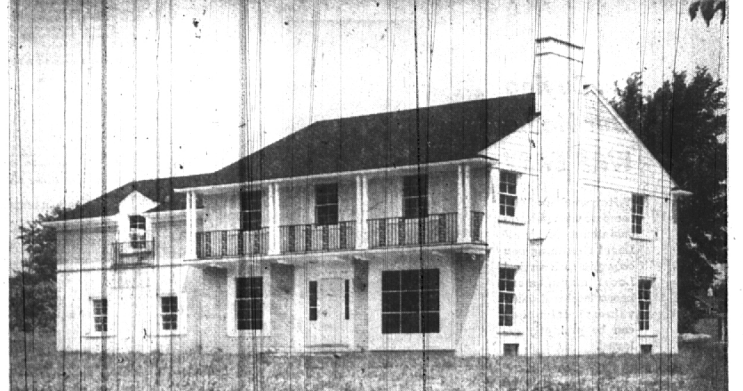
