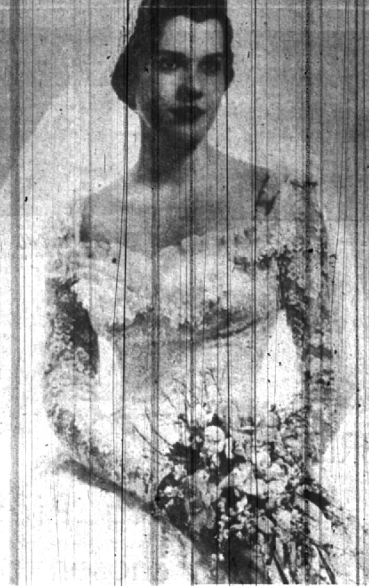
arrow. Rickie Johnston received a silver arrow (bear badge). Charles Baker of Robinwood avenue made the arrangements for the picnic.

**Kappa Alpha Theta Group To Indiana**

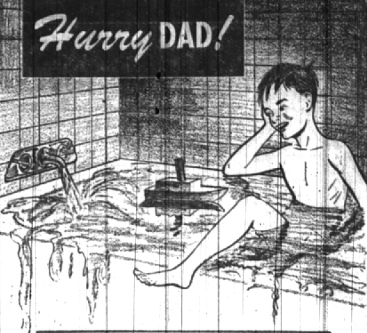
Delegates of district one of Kappa Alpha Theta will converge on Muncie, Ind., Culver, Ind., June 22-24 for their annual convention.

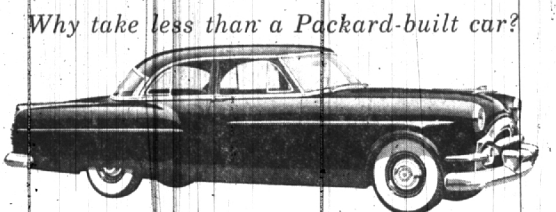
