Justice John J. Gail has announced that his court will cooperate wholeheartedly with the Michigan Safety Commission of Lansing in their attempt to curb accidents caused by improper passing.

The state, in a recent bulletin, warned motorists that police attention was being especially drawn to those drivers who pass in areas marked by yellow warning lines. State officials have promised action, especially when the driver is guilty of passing in a hill or curve.

Judge Gail said that persons brought before him on these charges would receive the full punishment permitted by law.

All-School Music Festival Tonight And Friday Night

The Birmingham public schools present the all-school music festival tonight and tomorrow night in the high school gym at 8 p.m.

The combined groups will open the program with "Anacrusis" under direction of Majel Brzette.

The fourth grade chorus will sing "The Lamb" and "American Lullaby"; "John's Beautiful Wife"; Slovak folkdance; "The Pirate"; "Schneewittchen"; and "All Through the Night", an old Welsh song. Maxine James will direct this group.

"Long Long Ago" by Bagley and "All through the Night" will be played by the first year instrumental students, with Robert Kutscher conducting.

The fifth grade choruses directed by Louise Federic will sing "From Sucoera to Waga", Swiss folk song, with the Adams dance group; "Down in Mexico", Mexican song; "Eric Canal", American folk song; and "Handkerchief Dance", Czech song.

"GRADUATION Overture", by De Lemates and "God of Our Fathers" will be played by the advanced grade school instrumentalists. Mr. Kutscher directing.

The sixth grade chorus will sing "Weevely Wheat", an English country dance, with the Quartet dance group; "Cockles and Mussels", an Irish air; "Floata", a Mexican folk dance; "The Witches are Ye Holy Ones", Kirchegeang, directed by Jonette Vier.

Mr. Kutscher will conduct all instrumentalists from the grade schools in the "Marines' Hymn" by Phillips.

"Swing Low Sweet Chariot", Negro spiritual; "Shine, Glorious Sun", "The Morning Star", "Czech folk song, and "Sourwood Mountain", folk song, will be sung by the high school choir.

Mr. Kutscher will conduct all instrumentalists from the grade schools in the "Marines' Hymn" by Phillips.

The Barnum girls' glee club follows with "Last Night the Nightingale", by H. Kjerfald; "When Love Is King"; and "My Garden is a Lovely Place", by E. MacLean, directed by Miss Brzette.

"The Balls of Irv", by Russell-Knight; "Climbin' Up the Mountain", Negro spiritual; and "It's a Grand Night for Singing", by Rodgers-Hammerstein will be sung by the Barnum mixed chorus also under Miss Brzette.

The Barnum orchestra will play "The Graduates", by Heferth, under Mr. Kutscher.

Arnold Bernat will conduct the Barnum band in "Little Suite for Band" by Ennio.

The high school girls' glee club under direction of Viktor Ulrich will sing "A Snow White", by Chokey, and "Lollytoddum", by Bell.

"MALAGUENA" by Lerona-Yoder will follow played by the high school band with Mr. Bernat conducting.

Mr. Ulrich will direct the high school choir in "You'll Never Walk Alone", by Rodgers-Hammerstein, and "No Man is an Island", by Whitney-Kramer.

The combined groups conclude the program with "America the Beautiful" under Mr. Ulrich's direction.
