When cutting peony blooms LEAVE some foliage on base of stalk OR cut only a few blooms from each stalk. Sow PORTULACA seed now in hot, exposed

Still time to plant DAHLIA ROOTS.

JUNE JITSUS (DON'T TIE YOURSELF IN KNOTS)

Hollyhocks and delph iniums should be dusted with SULPHUR or FERMATE or sprayed with BORDEAUX.

Ideal time for planting GLADIOLA. Keep dusting gladioli with 5% DDT (NEV-DUST) until buds show color.

You can still plant in June—Shirley Poppy, Gypsophilia, Bachelor Button, Gaillardia, Scabiosa, Zinnia and others.

Order BUCKWHEAT HULLS now and have them when you need them—later this month. (Greatest labor saver in the business.)

Flowers, especially roses keep best if harvested late in afternoon or intervening. Plunge at once into water,

Hollyhock blooms may be improved by thin-ning buds especially at tip.

Dust corn when it is a foot high with DDT. Get dust to base of leaves.

Train tomatoes with STAKES for earlier fruit. Leave 'em sprawl for longer bearing

Prune deutzias, spireas viburnum, and wieglas as soon as blooming season is over.

It is not too late to shape up foundation planting evergreens for symmetry.

Birch tree miners and other leaf chewing in-sects should be sprayed with BLACK-LEAF-40 plus soap or with 48% CHLORDANE (1 pint to 25 gal. water).
