


Aberdeen-Angus Group Lists Southfield Man





year when 154 pupils are expected to enrol at Wing Lake.

The proposed new high school would offer 118 classrooms, two gymnasiums, a cafeteria, a music department, industrial arts room, music room, general arts room, library-study unit, gymnasium, cafeteria, four administrative rooms and maintenance rooms.

BACKING THE need of the high school administrators contend that both classroom accommodations are at a premium at the present Vaughan school. The present school building no longer accommodates maximum home making department needs.

Coupled with this need for high school room, they say, is the rapid growth of elementary school enrollment. In fact, the projected enrollment of the high school will exceed the restriction of high school facilities.

The school board already owns the site and has the plans to build the high school on and the cost of the school would be purely for building and equipment.

THE HIGH SCHOOL, then, the school board urges would accommodate 900 students with a 200-student addition possible in the future. The site is on the south side of Woodward Avenue between Echo and Andover roads.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. at Vaughan school on the day, March 10, for the election.

Voters will be asked to vote on the passage of the bond issue and the millage increase.

Cranbrook Schools Open Scholarships

Scholarships for boarding and day students ready to enter any grade from the first through the eleventh will be awarded by Cranbrook School to applicants from all parts of the country who demonstrate financial need.

The competition, Harry D. Jones headmaster, has announced.

While there is no fixed number of scholarships to be made, 45 boys or 18 girls will receive enrollment, bold scholarships during the current school year.

Any boy may qualify for these scholarships if he demonstrates a definite need for financial aid and meets the following requirements: an above-average academic record; leadership qualities; participation in extra-curricular activities; and demonstration of good citizenship qualities. All applications must be filed by March 4.

Complete details of application procedure may be obtained from the Headmaster, Cranbrook School.

GIRLS READY Girls of any grade from the seventh through the eleventh are eligible to apply for boarding or day scholarships. Miss Marion E. Goodale, headmistress, has announced.

One of sixteen profit institutions founded by the King family, Cranbrook does not offer grants in a fixed number or size, although an average of 12% of the school enrollment receives scholarship aid.

All applications which must be in by April 1, should include evidence of above-average academic ability, leadership qualities in extra-curricular activities, and a demonstrated need for financial aid. 
