

Appeal Board To Decide Fate Of Archery Club

Southfield township's zoning board of appeals has been given the job of deciding whether or not the Pine Tree Archery club shall be permitted to continue using property of the Catholic Diocese within the township for an archery range.

Township board members have received numerous complaints from area residents on traffic, fire hazards and drinking on the premises.

Robert J. Burns, representing the club, said the range on Plum Hollow drive, in a section of the University of Detroit holidays, was drawing very little traffic and denied the drinking charges.

"We are all men of responsibility," he said, "and I have seen no drinking there. However, we have come back to the range, which we use mainly Saturdays and Sundays, and found car tracks into the property. These, with destroyed targets

are evidence that someone else goes there and to our detriment as well as that of nearby residents."

ONE MAN, building a house close to the range, complained of noise shooting at a rabbit, which ran across his property, endangering the life of one of his three children.

Other residents said traffic was increasing and that as the popularity of the range grew, they felt it would become a hazard and nuisance to the neighborhood.

"500' street built for heavy traffic," they said.

Building Inspector Frank Gidley informed Burns that he had made an attempt to check the suitability of the range users, and had been told by Catholic officials in Detroit that they have not issued permission to anyone.

BURNS SHOWED him a letter granting the use of the acreage, after which Gidley told him he was still at fault.

"You should have received permission from township officers, as well as from the owners," Gidley said.

Maples Score Lop-Sided Win Over Parkers

Setting a Pierce field high jump record, Maple Mickey Plumstead paced Birmingham to an 80-28 victory over Hazel Park just week.

Plumstead high jumped 4 ft. 11 1/2 ins., breaking the old record of 5 ft. 10 1/2 ins. set by Dick Hopkins, Birmingham, in 1945.

For the first time at Pierce field, the high hurdles were run on a regulation 120 yd. course with Jim Barker, Birmingham, winning the event in 1:02.2 and setting a new Pierce field record.

Birmingham slammed three events and captured eight other events to win 11 out of a possible 23 events.

Maple Ken Fowler won the pole vault at 120 ft. 4 in.; Tom Ejarada, Birmingham, won the broad jump at 18 ft.; and Plumstead the high jump to lead Birmingham's three clubs.

won the highs and lows for the meet's only double winner, Maple Bill Miner won the 100 yd. dash in 1:08.8 and Bill Dove, Birmingham, the 200 in 24.4.

Bank Curtis, Birmingham, won the shotput with a 47 ft. 3 1/2 in. heave. Maple John Perry took the 440 in 28.6.

The Vikings' only firsts were Ernest Bennett's 2:07.5 half mile, and Lesley Perry's mile in 8:50.8. Don Hite, John Moushgan, Jerry Harwood, and Al Fuhrmann teamed up to win the medley relay for Birmingham in 2:19.4. Moushgan, John Appleford, Harwood and Miner won the 800 yd. relay in 1:22.8.


