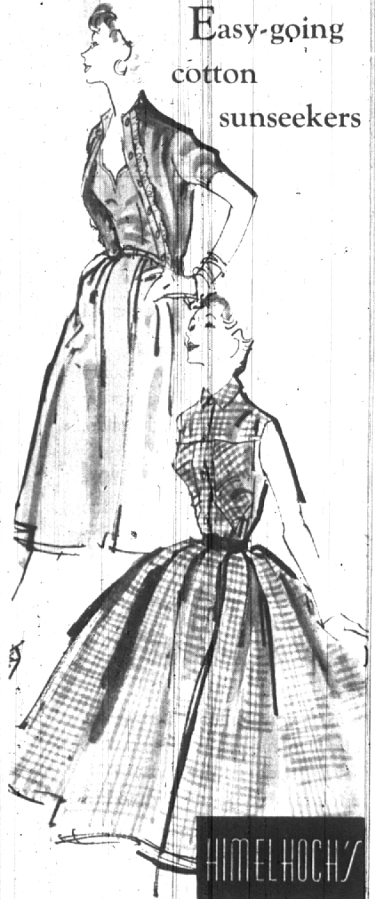

The group met at the Willow home of Mrs. James Bain. New members were named to the executive board, and officers were elected for the coming year.

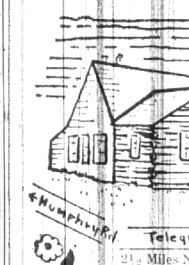

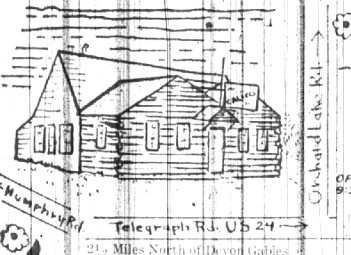
