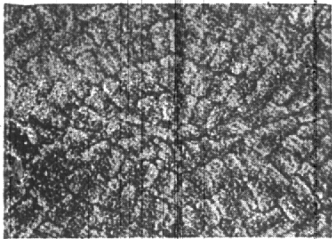


**Organ Society Hears R. D. Chapman, R. Moore**

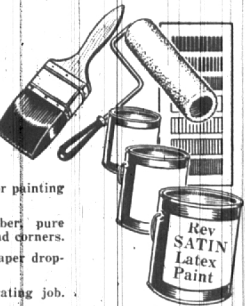
