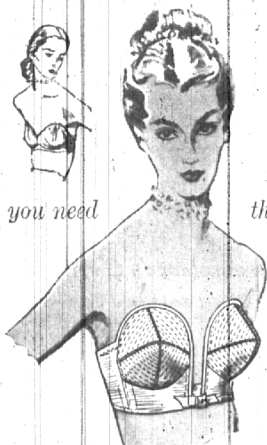

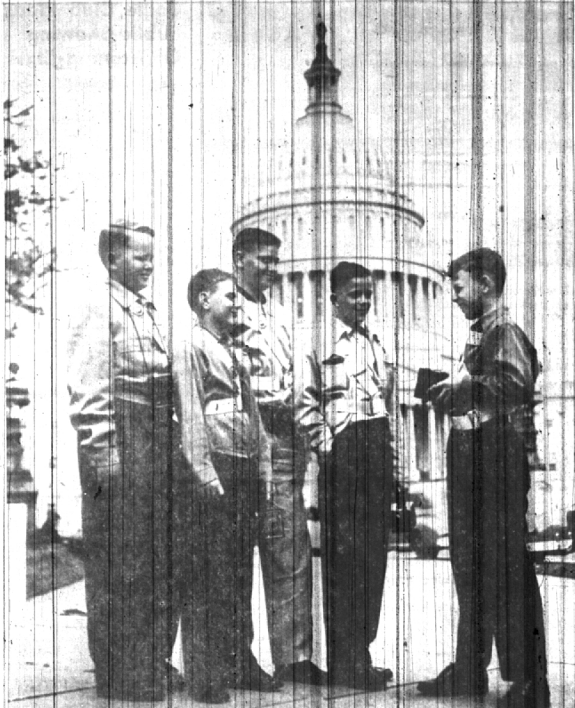

Junior Chamber Teenage Road-E-O Set For May 23

Birmingham teenagers Monday will take written examinations at the high school to qualify for the Teenage Road-E-O at the high school parking lot Saturday, May 22.

The 50 top tests, which will cover all traffic rules and regulations, will be selected for candidates to the trials which are sponsored both nationally and locally by the Junior Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with police departments and backed by the National Truckers Association.

The road-e-o, according to Birmingham Junior Chamber President James Kouzens will be the first step for local winners in vying for national driving honors. The local winner will be sent to the state contests in Lansing late in June with the state winner journeying to Washington, D. C. for the national competition. National contestants will be given an all-expense trip to the Capitol by the National Truckers Association.

Tests include parking, braking, forward and reverse driving, following a line and an obstacle course.

To qualify for the tests, contestants must be between 15 and 18 years old, attend a school in the Birmingham school district or live within the city. No contestant that has received a moving traffic violation within the past six months will be eligible.

The Birmingham Junior Chamber will be assisted by local, county and state police during the tests.
