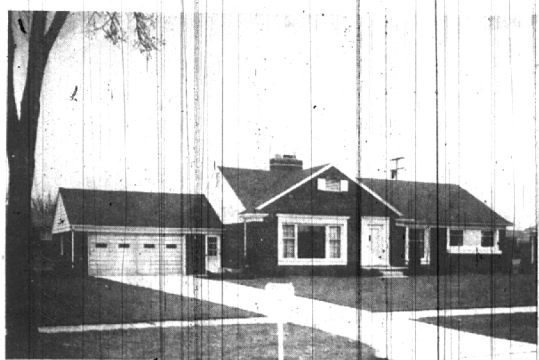

Tax Owners Feel Bite of Revised Dog Ordinance

Aimed at bringing about better control of dogs within the City of Birmingham, a revised dog ordinance approved by city commissioners Monday is going to make the wandering pooch an expensive pet.

An increased license fee, which would have hit the owner whose pet complies with all city regulations, was dropped, with license costs remaining the same—\$1 for male and \$2 for female dogs.

The age for licensing was dropped from six months to four months, with the rabies immunization necessary before the city clerk can license the animal.

The blow for owners, however, on the owner whose animal is permitted to roam at will and become a nuisance to his neighbors and a general safety hazard.

FIDO'S FIRST trip to the pound will cost his owner \$5, plus \$1.50 a day for board. This shall be paid when the owner presents evidence that the dog has had rabies immunization and is properly licensed.

Repeaters are allowed two trips to the pound in one year before the owner becomes subject to court action. He may be subjected to a maximum fine of \$100 or 30 days or both in the case of a first offender.

Does not claim within 72 hours shall be destroyed, or if deemed valuable may be sold by the police department for not less than the impounding fee due.

In cases where it is impossible or impractical for a dog to be impounded, written notice will be sent to the owner, who then has 72 hours to remove the dog to the police headquarters. If the notice is ignored, court action will be taken.

KENNEL OWNERS will be required to pay \$15 for a dog license rather than \$7.50 as in the past. Ten dogs constitute the maximum to be kept for each dog owner.

Restrictions concerning location of kennels, rabies immunization and the like remain the same.

In reviewing dog control laws in enforcement work, pound expenses, including food and heat, equipment rental, license forms and tags and clerical hours for issuing tags.

During the year 1,409 tags were sold for \$1,884. Impounding fees were \$215 and \$4 in fines from five court cases.

He said figures on dogs impounded and destroyed had risen each year, with 117 animals destroyed last year.

Aboard Destroyer In Korean Waters

Haydn M. Morgan Conducts Concert

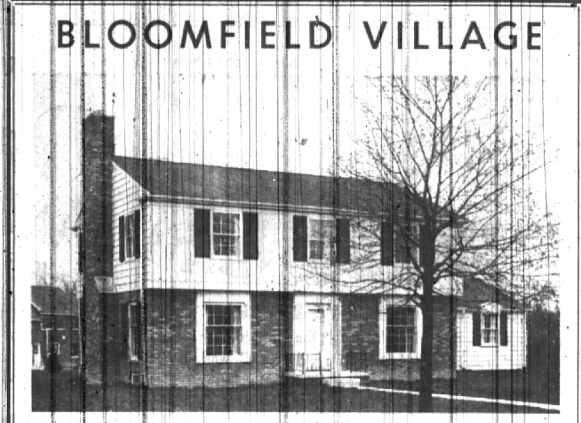
The spring concert of the high school choir next Thursday will feature Haydn M. Morgan, a composer, as guest conductor.

The concert will be presented in the high school gym next Thursday night at 8:15. Tickets may be purchased from choir members or from Victor Usher, director, or at the door.

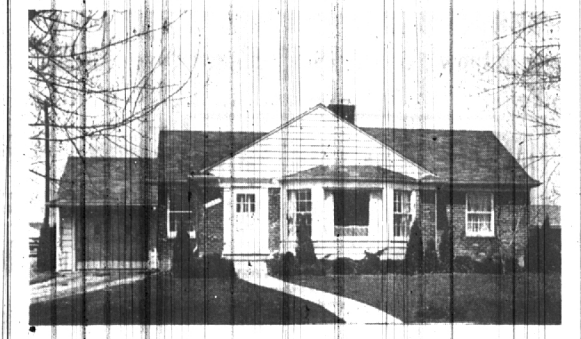
