

Western Reserve Falls To Cranes In Two-Hitter

On Saturday, May 9, the Cranbrook varsity baseball team trounced the Western Reserve Academy squad 4-1. This was the varsity's second straight league victory to place them in first place in the Interstate League.

This big stumbling block towards the excellent pitching of Captain Bill Soter, Soter struck out 10 batters to increase this year's total of strike-outs to 94 in 64 innings and allowed only four walks, two hits and one un-earned run. The important part of this performance was Soter's ability to bear down in the clutch with runners on base. Consequently, Reserve left eight men on the sacks.

THE HOME SQUAD tallied first in the opening on a walk, sacrifice and two-base error. The Cranes retaliated with a run in the second inning on a single by Coburn Cochran, an error and a run scoring single by catcher George Gary. The Blue and Gray scored again in the third frame when Harry Lomason got to second on a two-base error, advanced to third on a sacrifice and tagged up to score on Don Sietkin's fly ball to right field.

This one run margin stood until the top of the seventh inning when the Cranes scored two runs to tie the game. Lou Mitchell, Coburn Cochran and George Gary made the bases on an error, walk and fielder's choice. John West followed with a grounder to the second baseman and Mitchell was tossed out at the plate. Lomason then laid down a squeeze bunt that scored Cochran. Next Joe Freshberg hit a sharp grounder to third that scored Gary with the final run.
