

To Improve Facilities at Forest Lake

Forest Lake Golf Club has started a \$25,000 expansion program to improve the club's facilities for golfers, according to W. D. Weitzel, operator of the popular club on Square Lake near Telegraph and Bloomfield Hills.

The changes are to be made in the clubhouse itself and will include a new men's locker room, complete with new showers and toilets. It will also include a new snack room, separate from the main dining room. A new locker room, complete with a lounge, is to be provided for the ladies. Plans also call for a new, modernly equipped kitchen and the

main dining room is being remodeled and redecorated.

THE CLUB has discontinued its policy of large party groups and in the future only groups of moderate size will be accommodated. Other party groups have been discontinued in favor of making the course more accessible to the golfers.

According to Weitzel, starting times for weekends are to be accepted and these can be obtained by "non-members" by phoning the club no later than Thursday night for the current weekend. This feature is expected to relieve much of the usual waiting, he said.

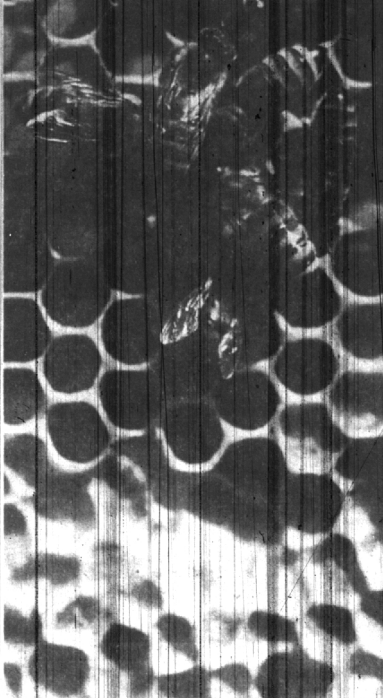

Will Pay for First Aid Kit When It's Delivered

Recognizing the city's responsibility to pay \$175.75 for a civil defense first aid kit, Birmingham city commissioners, nevertheless have voted to withhold payment until the kit is delivered.

City Manager Donald C. Egehart was notified April 30 that payment should be made prior to May 1, for the kit ordered in June 1951 by John J. Hamel, then civil defense director for the city.

The city will pay \$5 per cent of the cost of the kit, a like sum being paid by the state and the balance by the federal government.



BUSY BEES GO ABOUT THEIR BEES-NESS Revolutionary plastic comb calmly accepted

First Major Change In Bee Hive Interiors

Modernization and pre-fab housing has hit the bees! At Cranbrook, Holland R. Sperry, science instructor and his students have successfully made an artificial comb from plastics which has been readily accepted by the bees.

Although man has done a great deal through the years to change the exterior of his homes, nothing has ever been done about furnishings before. The bees have done their own interior decorating by their own wax which, with satisfactory, has left room for improvement.

The wax comb was easily damaged and always in danger from bee-wax moths. These little creatures enter the hive and lay their eggs in the wax. The hatched grubs feed on the wax and make many hours of repair work for the bees. The grubs have no taste, the scientists say, for plastic.

Another benefit from the artificial comb is its resistance to disease. Any infection in the hive, with wax comb, has meant the destruction of the whole structure. The plastic can be cleaned, disinfected and used again.

Since bees can manufacture either honey or wax from the nectar they gather, the plastic comb frees huge amounts for conversion into honey, increasing the yield of this food production.

Perhaps one of the most important features of the plastic comb was discovered by accident. Bee keepers have always faced the problem of the queen laying her eggs in sections intended to store honey for later use. When this happens the entire section is ruined.

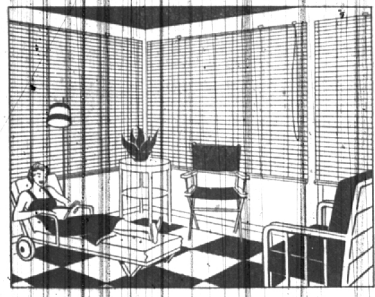
