Seek Condemnation Of Old Lumber Shed

Condemnation and removal of an alleged fire hazard on the east side of Huntey, midway between Maple and Riedelsale, is being sought by Birmingham city officials.

Monday night city commissioners instructed Fire Chief Vern W. Griffith to ask the state fire marshal's office to proceed with condemnation proceedings under an existing state law.

Griffith already has asked the owner of the building, which is a former lumber storage shed not now occupied, to make certain changes that would remove the fire hazard.

Top PGA Prize Money Is Increased

The winner of the Professional Golfers' Association Championship July 1-7 at Birmingham Country Club will support the claim it pays to show one's wares in the Detroit district.

The champion's share of the prize money will be \$5,000, the largest in the history of the 37-year-old event. The runner-up will collect \$3,500, also a new high. The previous tops were \$3,300 and \$1,500.

This will be the end time this classic of professional golf has been played in the Detroit district. In 1947 at neighboring Plum Hollow, Jim Ferrier defeated Chick Herbert in a sensational final.

Local tournament officials hope the big prize list will lure the top-drawers professionals from throughout the country for the week-long endurance testing event.

OBJECT of the race is to call attention to the easy and beautiful canoeing water within forty miles of Detroit. Dondero to Make Two Military Appointments

Congressman George A. Dondero this week said the 18th Congressional District of Michigan, which is composed only of Oakland County, will be given a vacancy at the United States Military Academy at West Point and one at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., for the classes of 1954.

Entrance at these Academies is about July 1 of that year.

Any young man who resides in Oakland County, who wishes to compete in a civil service examination for designation, should contact Congressman Dondero immediately.

IF SUCH applicant meets the requirements of the Departments of the Army and Navy, he will be allowed to take the examination and be given the appointment provided he obtains a high enough rating in the civil service examination and is able to pass a preliminary physical examination.

The competitive examination for designation will be held July 13, 1953; but all requirements must be approved by Congressman Dondero before June 4, 1953.
