ANNAPOLIS, Md. - The U. S. Naval Academy will graduate the second largest class John E. Booth since its founding 105 years ago. The largest class was in 1949 with 1,046 members.

Among the 926 scheduled to graduate and receive a Bachelor of Science degree is Midshipman First Class Roger E. Booth, 28 son of Air Force Col. and Mrs. William G. Booth of 1951 Gratiot.

He is expected to be commissioned an Ensign, U.S.N.

Mid. Booth entered the Naval Academy on a congressional appointment from Michigan in June, 1949, after graduating from Thomas A. Robert High School in Berlin, Germany. He also attended Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.

Booth has first class rank at the Naval Academy, he attained the rank of Midshipman Lieutenant, and during the war term.
