

Pontiac Tourney Won By Maples

Birmingham High school's golf team walked off with the honors at the Pontiac Invitational Golf Tourney at Pontiac Municipal Course Monday afternoon.

Competing in the tourney for the first time, Birmingham golfers Joe Glass, Bill Donaldson, Tim Baldwin, Spike Osler and Art Lee defeated the area schools for the trophy and school plaque.

Birmingham's medalist, Joe Glass, had most medalist Lloyd Syron of Shrine High school by carding a 73, but lost out to Syron in a sudden-death playoff.

Glass's card was a school record as was the five man total in the meet of 393. The team also established a school low four man record with 309.

Birmingham scores were Glass, 73; Donaldson, 75; Baldwin, 78; Osler, 82; and Lee, 84. Charles Buell is the school's golf course.

Shrine placed second in the meet.

Post Office Made Advance Plans for Special Edition

Nearly 10 tons of paper were handled last Thursday as members of the Birmingham post office distributed subscriber copies of The Eccentric's 75th Anniversary issue.

Postmaster Bernard Fowler said the entire carrier staff of 25, plus 25 substitutes and four substitute clerks were put into carrier service. Men voluntarily cancelled regular leave days, he said, to make their services available.

Notified of the extra heavy load weeks in advance, Fowler and his staff made plans which included packaging papers in lots of about 35 pounds each. Householders along the various carrier routes were pressed into service, and as early as 7 a.m., bundles of papers were placed on porches to be distributed later by the carriers.

Ask More Details On Pierce Paving

Birmingham school board members have asked for a more detailed report on the paving of Pierce street pavement before agreeing to pay an additional \$400 to the city as the school's share of the assessment.

The board approved the payment of \$118,250 for the original plan to pave and widen Pierce to 57 feet.

Resident opposition to the widening changed the plans of the city commission who ordered that the pavement be kept to 24 feet. Elmer Haack, city assessor reported that the corrected assessment figure would require the school district to pay \$12,729.43.

Board members were at a loss to explain the higher cost of a narrower street and asked Superintendent Dwight B. Ireland to obtain complete details on the improvement.
