The Romeros are both doing graduate work in this country. Mrs. Romero is taking further training in marriage counseling and family life education at the Merrill Palmer School in Detroit, while her husband is carrying on advanced studies at the school of education of Wayne

University, who has the equivalent of a master's degree in English education, has had two years of studies in the school of economic science as well as courses in the school of law and social sciences of the University of Buenos Aires.

She is professor of English in the school of modern languages at the University of Buenos Aires, counselor to the freshmen girls, and works with the pastor of the First Methodist Church of Buenos

Aires in pre-marital and marriage counseling.

MR. AND MRS. Romero have collaborated on a translation of Dr. Paul Popenoe's book "Marriage Preparation". They believe that their year of study in the United States has enabled them to correct many misconceptions regarding American life and they hope to disseminate this viewpoint back in the Argentine.

Mrs. Romero is in the United States through the Exchange Visitor program of the Institute of International Education, and is the recipient of a grant-in-aid from Altrusa, International, Inc. She expects to return to Argentina in July.

and Mrs. Wendell Bush, Mrs. James Gibson and Howard McCullagh, all of Detroit.

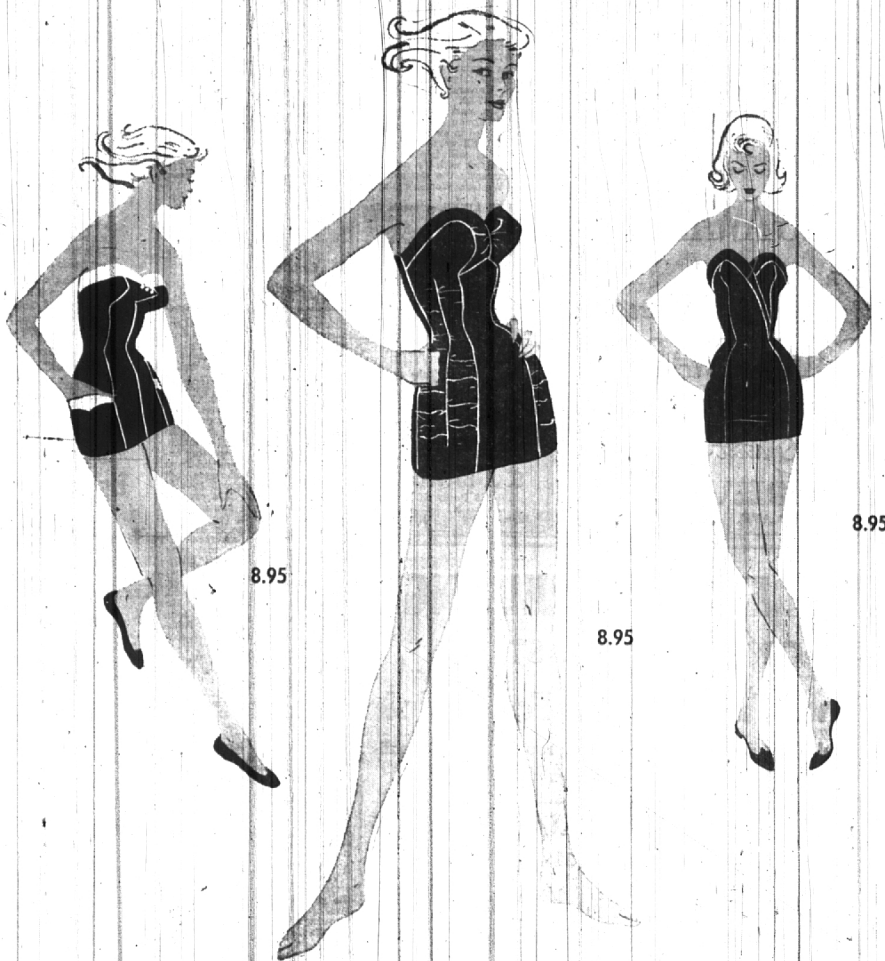

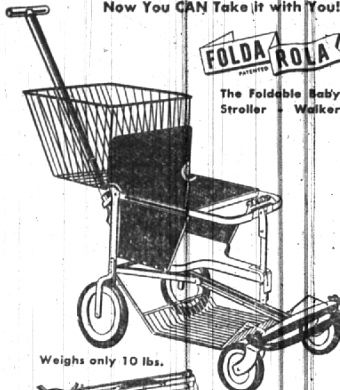
