Disagree Regarding Oak St. Extension

Negotiations between the city and the oil company which owns the triangular parcel at the north intersection of U.S. 10 and Woodward will be started by Birmingham City Manager D. C. Egbert for the sale of the property.

The manager told city commissioners that the oil company would like the Oak street extension angled northeast to split the property so a service station can be erected on one side of the new street, a leased garage on the other side.

Both the city and the state highway department prefer the extension to be made directly east to U. S. 10.

Boost Seen in Rates For Rubbish Service In-Business Section

Rates for rubbish collection in the business areas should be made to pay for the service, City Manager D. C. Egbert has emphasized to Birmingham city commissioners.

The report of the city assessor indicates business property pays approximately 12 per cent of the total tax, and it would appear that the business section would be entitled to rubbish collection to the extent of 12 per cent of the total budget for rubbish collection, or approximately \$5,000, Egbert explained.

It would appear, therefore, that the rubbish collection rates for the

service performed for the business section should return a revenue to the city of approximately \$5,000 annually. The present return from this source is approximately \$3,200.

EGBERT SAID there were two or three other reports due next week by contractors with various phases of rubbish collection. Commissioners agreed to review the matter next Monday night, since they already have included in the tentative 1953-54 budget a revenue of \$9,000 from rubbish collections.

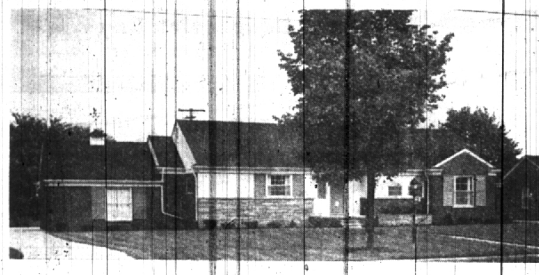

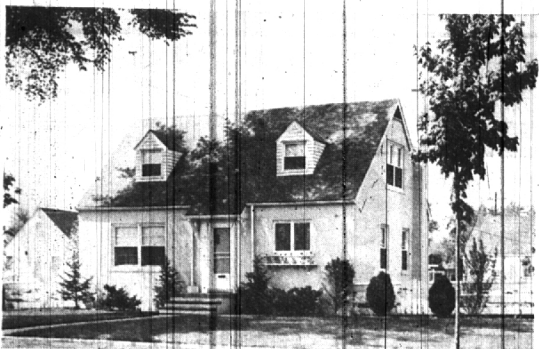

Set Hearing Dates

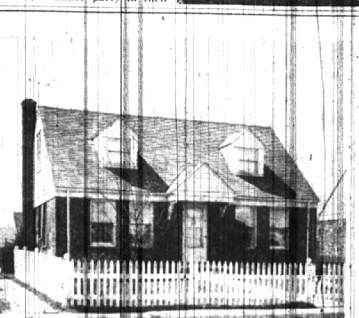

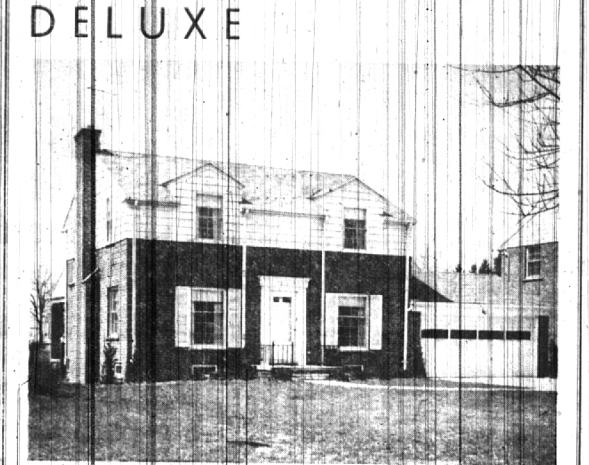

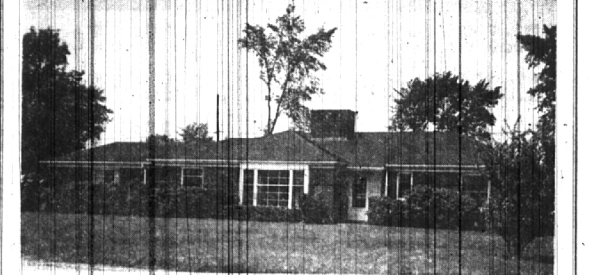
