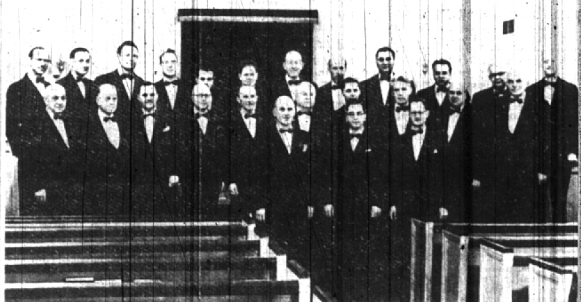

Chicagoan Speaks Here on May 29

Under the sponsorship of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Birmingham, Harold Molter, Chicago Science lecturer will speak on "Christian Science: The Science of Right Thought and Action," on May 29. The program will be held in the Baldwin school auditorium beginning at 8:15 p.m., and is open to the public. His lecture will explain how Christianity, as taught in Christian Science, can heal sickness and free people from problems and discord. Prior to entering this field, Molter had held various educational posts in the United States, including an executive position with the Federal government. He had also been superintendent of a private school in Chicago. He has been a Science lecturer since 1946, traveling widely in his work. Three years ago he made a trip around the world, lecturing extensively in the Pacific area, India and Europe. He has been a public practitioner of Christian Science healing since 1931 and an authorized teacher since 1943.
