

**Public Notice**  
 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Birmingham City Planning Board on **TUESDAY, MAY 12, 1953 AT 8:00 P.M.** in the Municipal Building for the purpose of discussing amendments to the Zoning Ordinance, briefly described as:  
 1. Limiting the density of residential development in the Commercial zones to that which is permitted in the Income-Bungalow District.  
 2. Creation of a new zoning classification to be known as "PARKING DISTRICT" which would permit properly sited and developed parking areas to be located adjacent to Business Zoned property.  
 3. A revision to Article 20 of the Zoning Ordinance which would retain the required parking for residential and industrial uses and in addition, require that commercial buildings, additions thereto, provide off-street parking. It would also require proper screening of parking lots in the business zone where such lots abut residential property.  
 This is an informal hearing conducted by the Planning Board. Before the ordinance can be amended, it will be necessary for the City Commission to hold a formal hearing.
