**Slight Increase Shown In Construction Work in City for April**

With 60 new building and 25 alterations permits issued by the Birmingham building inspector's office in April, construction showed a slight increase over the previous month and for April '52.

April construction totals were \$51,852, bringing the total for the first third of the year to \$1,548,855, slightly below the 1952 figure of \$1,599,470.

March figures for 1953-52 were \$470,064 and \$274,655, with 445, 015 for April 1952.

A break down of current figures show 25 new single family dwellings, 129,400; 4 new business places, 47,200; 31 new private garages, 23,545.

Alterations permits were issued for 21 single unit dwellings, \$29,500; 3 business, \$15,000 and one private garage, \$150. One wrecking permit for a single family residence was also issued.

In addition the building inspector's office issued 57 electrical permits, 22 plumbing and 76 heating.

## Wonder Drugs Make New Cranbrook Display Especially Interesting

A sample of the original "wonder drug" penicillin will be among several items on exhibit at the Cranbrook Institute of Science during May. The museum is open to the public without charge from 9 to 5 p.m. daily.

The "wonder drug" exhibit includes a display of the original Flemming strain and a later variation, an X-ray machine producing 2,000 pairs of penicillin per cubic centimeter in contrast to 25 of the original strain. This exhibit is not expected to last more than the first seven days of May.

Recently acquired minerals from Europe include several showy opals, hydrozoites, a mineral new to the collection and pieces of amber from Sicily, Latvia, Lithuania, Burma and China.

Small original sculptures by the Eskimos of Barrow, land will be exhibited and sold. These greenstone pieces depict bears, wolves, whales, birds and Eskimos.

Collectors brought back from the Middle East by Dr. Robert T. Hart, director of Cranbrook Institute of Science, include jewelry from Bedouins and other Arabs, Koran and Christian peoples of Mesopotamia, as well as unique astronomical instruments.

These articles will go on exhibit later in the summer.
