**DR. THOMAS J. MASON**, chairman of women's activities of the National Polio Foundation in the Birmingham area and chairman of the annual fund drive here, will moderate the panel discussion which will highlight the Adams PTA program at eight o'clock Monday evening, May 11, in the school gym.

Forming the panel will be Dr. Robert Mason; Helen Lehman, Detroit Visiting Nurse and physiotherapist; Ruth Parrshall, executive secretary of the Oakland County chapter of the National Polio Foundation; and Annye Gillett, Birmingham board of health nurse.

DR. MASON will give the medical picture in the light of the most recent findings on polio, while Miss Lehman will discuss the newest, most successful methods of care.

The program of the nationwide campaign in combating the disease will be analyzed by Miss Parrshall and Miss Gillett will outline the local facilities available for polio patients.

The program will cover Gamma Globulin, vaccines and therapies, and is aimed at helping to dispel the "summer hysteria" over polio.
