The Cranbrook School Varsity baseball team handed a 3-2 defeat to Catholic Central High School of Detroit on Tuesday, April 29th. For years the Cranbrook baseball team has tried to schedule a contest with Detroit Catholic Central. With Catholic Central retiring from their league last year, this long awaited event became possible Tuesday, April 29th at the Cranes' field.

Cranbrook Captain William Soter pitched a five-hitter and allowed three walks while retiring eleven Catholic Central batters on strikes. The Cranes collected eight hits and six walks and eight Cranbrook batters were struck out by the two Catholic Central pitchers, Ken Barnes and Dick Herbert. Herbert is the brother of Detroit Tiger pitcher, Ray Herbert, and Dick recently pitched a no-hit.

THE GAME opened with Soter opposing Barnes and was scoreless until the top of the fourth inning when Catholic Central got two runs on three hits and a walk. Central first baseman, John Pecos walked and shortstop Ralph Smith singled. With two out, Barnes hit a tremendous triple along the left-field line which was good for what proved to be Central's only score of the game. The visitors did not threaten as Soter allowed no hits the rest of the way.

In the home half of the fourth Cranbrook got their first run as a result of doubles by third baseman Don Slotkin and second baseman Larry Asbury, who had three hits and two runs batted in during the contest.

The game was tied up in the sixth as Soter singled, moved to second on a wild pitch, and scored on a infield hit by Asbury and scored on Crane catcher George Cary's squeeze bunt. Asbury proved to be the game's hero, as his third hit, another infield scratch, scored pinch-runner Dwight Davis from third in the seventh for the winning run.

Cranes Blank USC For Fifth Win

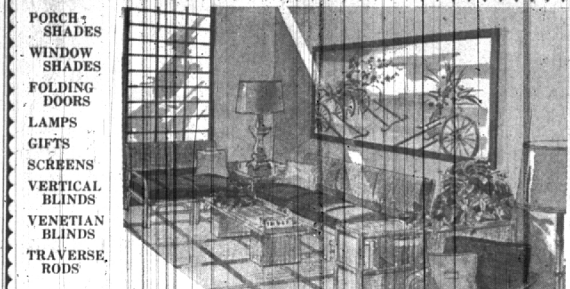
